Biden says he is 'doing well,' working after testing positive for COVID

WASHINGTON, July 21 (Reuters) - Joe Biden, the oldest person ever to serve as president of the United States, has tested positive for COVID-19, is experiencing mild symptoms and will continue working but in isolation, the White House said on

Biden, 79, has a runny nose, fatigue and an occasional dry cough, symptoms which he began to experience late on Wednesday, White House physician Kevin O'Connor said in a note released on Thursday. Biden has begun taking the antiviral treatment Paxlovid, O'Connor said.

Fully vaccinated and twice boosted. Biden said he was "doing well" in a video posted on his Twitter account. In the 21-second clip, he also said he was "getting a lot of work done" and would continue with his duties.

A photograph on his Twitter account showed him smiling, wearing a blazer and sitting at a desk

White House COVID coordinator, Dr. Ashish Jha, said Biden's oxygen levels were normal and the president would isolate for five days and return to public events once he had a negative COVID test.

Biden became ill at a time when his administration is grappling with soaring inflation, global supply challenges, mass shootings and Russia's land assault on Ukraine.

His illness forced cancellation of a trip to Pennsylvania where Biden intended to lay out plans to ask Congress for \$37 billion for crime prevention

The White House provided an unusually detailed account of the president's morning activities, including a series of phone calls to political allies.

The Pfizer Inc (PFE.N) antiviral drug Paxlovid that Biden is taking has been shown to reduce the risk of severe disease by nearly 90% in high risk patients if given within the first five days of infection.

But Paxlovid has in some cases been associated with rebound infections, in which patients improve quickly and test negative after a five-day course of the drug, with symptoms returning days

Dr. Bruce Farber, chief of infectious diseases at



Northwell Health in New York, who is not treating the president, said Paxlovid is likely the only treatment Biden will get, unless his symptoms worsen.

"Elderly people are more at risk for developing complications from COVID," Farber said. "It dramatically is lower if you've been vaccinated and doubly boosted, which he has been, so I anticipate he will do very well."

At Biden's last physical in November 2021, doctors reported that the president has atrial fibrillation, a common irregular heartbeat for which he takes Eliquis, a drug designed to prevent blood clots and reduce the risk of heart attacks and stroke.

Jha said Biden will stop taking Eliquis and the statin Crestor while on his Paxlovid treatment to avoid a negative interaction between the drugs.

HARRIS, PELOSI TEST NEGATIVE Multiple members of Biden's administration and

other senior figures in Washington have tested positive for the coronavirus in recent months, including Vice President Kamala Harris and House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi, both of whom have since tested negative and resumed working.

While many Americans have moved on from the strict precautions of the pandemic's early months, returning to offices and schools and resuming summer travel, the virus has been spreading rapidly.

U.S. cases are up more than 25% in the last month, according to CDC data, with the BA.5 subvariant taking

Evading the immune protection afforded either by vaccination or prior infection, BA.5 has been the dominant subvariant in the United States since at least early July and has driven a surge of new infections globally. read

More than 1 million people have died from COVID in the United States. Most of those deaths, some 600,000, happened after Biden took office in January 2021 at the peak of a major wave of the disease.

'GET VACCINATED NOW'

Biden set up strict COVID-19 safety protocols at the White House, urged Americans to take the virus seriously and campaigned for everyone to get fully vacci-

He is tested regularly for the disease and anyone who meets with him or travels with him is tested beforehand, the White House has said. Biden had last tested negative on Tuesday.

He has stopped wearing a mask at public events in recent months, and the White House dropped its mask requirement ahead of his March 1 State of the Union Address.

Russia's War On Water In Ukraine WATER AS A WEAPON OF WAR

Water is becoming increasingly scarce and an even more powerful weapon in war, scientists warn.

In Russia's war on Ukraine, water is both a target and a weapon.

Just three days after the start of the latest invasion. Russian forces destroyed a dam in Ukraine's Kherson region that had blocked water access to Russian-annexed Crimea.

In Mariupol, a city in southeastern Ukraine, Russian soldiers shut off local water supply as part of a brutal siege on the city, leaving the trapped population without access to safe drinking water or sanitation. The city fell into Russian hands earlier this week.

Moscow has made a point of targeting water infrastructure — including pipes, sewage treatment plants and pumping stations — in air strikes across the entire country, according to Tobias von Lossow. a research fellow at Dutch think tank Clingendael. Blockading water supplies for local populations, as Russian forces did in Mariupol, has also proven to be a powerful

"Three months on, we see a humanitarian catastrophe and the starvation of cities — Mariupol or also Mykolaiv [a city in southern Ukraine], which has been without water for over a month," said von Lossow. "The situation is particularly worrying in the heavily embattled or occupied territories in the east and the south."

The EU's foreign policy chief Josep Borrell and Commissioner for the Environment Virginijus Sinkevičius in March accused Russia of "using the threat of dehydration to force the surrender of [Mariupol] and denying access to the most basic needs."

A Broken Taboo

Attacks on civilian water infrastructure violate international conventions. But the tactic has become increasingly common over the past decade, particularly in the Middle East, and it's one that Russia also routinely relies on, according to Ashok Swain, UNESCO's chair of international water cooperation.

"Thirst can kill—and so can hunger—

when essential agriculture goes dry." "As a close ally to the regime in Damascus, Russia has contributed to this weaponization of water in Syria, for example with attacks on pumping stations," said von Lossow. "The Syrian regime and some of the opposition forces and also external actors kind of standardized the weaponization of water. We then saw similar

The tactic is attractive not only for its rapid impact, but also for demoralizing targeted populations, said Mark Zeitoun, director general of the Geneva Water Hub, a

Blocked access to water — or its contamination as a result of shelling of infrastructure like chemical sites can also do long-term damage to a country's economy. The United Nations Environment Program warned in 2018 that the Donbas region was "on the precipice of an ecological catastrophe fueled by air, soil and water pollution from the combustion of large amounts of ammunition in the fighting and flooding at industrial plants."

With hundreds of chemical, metallurgical and mining sites, atomic energy plants and nuclear waste dumps spread across Ukraine, the risks of water-borne diseases caused by water contamination are high," said Juliane Schillinger, a researcher at the University of Twente in the Netherlands.

Valuable Water Weaponizing water is particularly effective when it is

scarce or when a country - such as Ukraine, known as Europe's breadbasket — is a heavily dependent on agriculture and irrigation. With climate change



set to make water even more scarce in a number of regions, it will increasingly play role in conflicts,"

said Peter Gleick, co-founder of the Pacific Institute, a global water think tank.

According to the United Nations, nearly 6 billion people will suffer from clean water scarcity by 2050. Over half of the world's projected 9.7 billion people will live in water-stressed regions by then, MIT researchers

"We're seeing more and more violence associated with water, as water becomes more scarce and more urgent and as climate change affects how much water we get and where we get it," said Gleick, who tracks these conflicts in the World Water Chronology database. (Courtey https://www.politico.eu/arti)

Water Emerges As Weapon Of War In

Ukraine And Beyond At the beginning of the war in Ukraine, Russian forces destroyed a concrete dam in southern Ukraine. Ukrainians had built the structure in 2014, after Russia illegally annexed Crimea, with the aim of blocking Dniener River water that had flowed to Crimea since the Soviet era and diverting it to the Ukrainian city of

It is unclear whether the attack on the dam was Russia's way of settling a score in the early days of its unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, but it highlights how disrupting an enemy's access to water can be an especially vicious tactic of war, and since water makes food production possible, how it can be used with devastating impact on civilians.



According to the water-focused think tank Pacific Institute, there have been a number of instances around the world this year military where

action has destroyed water supply. In addition to the dam in Ukraine, there was an airstrike that hit water tanks in Yemen and an assault by the insurgent group Al-Shabaab on water supply in Somalia, which killed 10 soldiers and injured 15. In Mali, attacks on villages took out water infrastructure and killed four, and in Palestine. the Israeli military destroyed agricultural facilities that included a water tank. In Syria, a country already suffering through years of war and drought, Russian warplanes wrecked a water station and also wounded a worker.

"The basic idea of war is that it's organized violence and to use the threat of force to compel people," said Matthew Schmidt, an associate professor of national security and political science at the University of New Haven. "Because we have to drink water to survive, it's always been a weapon of war." After post-World War II human-rights accords, the instances where water was used as a weapon subsided. With climate change making drought likelier and water scarcer, that might be starting to shift, Schmidt said. "There was a moral sense that we shouldn't do that. In Ukraine, you ponder whether Russia has broken that taboo."

Ukraine is known as Europe's "breadbasket", and a global hunger catastrophe looms as war pinches the country's harvests of staples such as wheat and sunflower oil. North Africa and the Middle East are especially vulnerable because they're big customers of Ukrainian agriculture. Water, of course, has a lot to do with farming.





Human life is unimaginable without water. Worldwide, 2.2 billion people don't have access to safe water, which makes them more vulnerable to malnutrition and death. Better water, sanitation and hygiene could prevent at least 9% of global disease and 6% of global deaths, according to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention. Conflict is a major driver of insecure access to clean and safe water. Water can be a source of conflict and at the same time a resource that

becomes scarcer in conflict. Since 2020, the Pacific Institute has tracked more than 200 instances of water-related conflict, compared to 629 total in the entire decade prior. Peter Gleick, a senior fellow at the institute and its president-emeritus, says it's only a matter of time before climate change pushes even more tension to the surface. Gleick expects that eventually conflicts over water will pop up

in America. "Reservoirs are low. The snowpack is disappearing at a record rate. We're going to see conflicts in the sense that farmers and cities are not getting all of the water that they want," Gleick said. "When there's a shortfall, everybody tries to find somebody else's water." (Courtesy forbes.com)

In Syria, Water Has Been Used As A Weapon Of War



In an area of northern Syria, already struck by desertification which has been dramatically intensified by the global climate crisis, water is being used as a weapon of war. KEYPOINT

Turkey is restricting access to a vital life source for thousands of people in northeast Syria. A new crowdfunder is raising money for water infrastructure in the region.

Turkey invaded Rojava in October 2019 after Trump announced US military withdrawal from the region. Turkish forces bombed the main water station on the first day of the invasion of Serekaniye (a city whose name, in Kurdish, means 'fountainhead', or 'water source') and surrounding towns and villages. Since then, the water has been shut-off on five further occasions, denving more than 650,000 people of access to water, just as the Covid-19 pandemic hit. In addition to this, Turkey has dammed the rivers which flow from Turkey into Syria and Iraq, detaining water inside its own borders, causing a big reduction in the flow of water to the wider region-by an estimated 80 per cent

to Iraq and by around 40 per cent to Syria. In response to the ongoing crisis, UK-based co-oper-

ative the Solidarity Economy Association (SEA) has come together with a number of other international organizations and women's structures in Rojava to launch a big crowdfunding campaign for water infrastructure and women's co-operatives in the region. It aims to raise £100.000 (\$123.463). The #Water4Rojava crowdfunding campaign launched on 16 May and reached £25,000 (\$30,865) in the first week. The campaign is also being match funded up to the first £50,000 and is being supported by well-known figures, including British actress Maxine Peak, David Graeber, Debbie Bookchin, Janet Biehl and world-re-

nowned photographer Joey Lawrence. Since the subsequent invasion and occupation of Serekaniye and Tel Abyad in late 2019, water is now being weaponized and water infrastructure targeted

as never before 'Most of the water sources in the region were in Serekaniye and we lost them with the invasion,' explains Heval Armanc from Aborîya Jin (Women's Economy) - an autonomous women's economic body in

northeast Syria. "We have been struggling a lot more since we lost access to the water resources. We have some women's economy projects, like our project in Derîk (another city in Rojava), where we are digging wells, planting trees and building houses. With all that we do, we are

mindful about nature and not to cause any harm.' Turkey controls 90 per cent of the waterflow of the Euphrates, and around 44 per cent of the Tigris, the two main rivers of the region. Since 1992, the government has built 22 major dams which hold back the headwaters of these two great rivers. Within Turkey's borders, hundreds of towns and villages have been submerged and (mostly Kurdish) residents forced into cities and away from traditional ways of life. Downstream in Iraq, regions such as the ecologically and culturally unique Mesopotamian Marshes and the Marsh Arabs who depend on them for subsistence are also at threat



of extinction.

In Syria, Turkey has been directly at war with the predominantly Kurdish population of the northern regions since its invasion and continued occupation of Afrin in early 2018. This is now escalating since the subsequent invasion and occupation of Serekaniye and Tel Abyad in late 2019, and water is now being weaponized and water infrastructure targeted as never before.

The local Directorate of Water, the citizen-led municipalities, the Women's Economy, local charities and NGOs, all have plans for alternative measures to provide water, but pressures such as an economic embargo on the region and food insecurity caused by the depleted water supply, climate change and the ongoing conflict, mean that there are not enough funds to go ahead with all the projects. The Return Of Measles

Measles — declared eradicated in the U.S. in 2000 — has roared back at a record pace this year.

Why it matters: Most Americans have no firsthand experience with measles and that lack of familiarity, along with the online success of the anti-vaccine movement, is giving a deadly but easily preventable virus an opening to spread.

UPDATE:

•695 confirmed cases of measles in 22 states

•More than 70 new confirmed cases reported in just the past week.

•5 states reporting ongoing outbreaks as of Monday (at least 3 cases in one place counts as an outbreak).

We may be a victim of our own success in squelching what used to be a ubiquitous virus that is extremely contagious.

•According to the CDC, prior to 1963, between 3 to 4 million were infected each year and nearly all children got measles by the time they were 15 years old.

•A CDC spokesperson tells Axios that among reported cases, an estimated 400 to 500 people died annually prior to widespread vaccination, 48,000 were hospitalized and 1,000 suffered encephalitis (swelling of the brain) from measles.

Now, due in large part to vaccination efforts that began in 1963, most Americans



•Parents may be fooled into thinking that measles is a relatively mild disease. similar to the flu, and think vaccination is unnecessary or not a priority.

•This is not only wrong, but it could have deadly consequences.

"Parents may think that many vaccine-preventable diseases are mild, but there's no way to tell how serious a disease may be for a child," CDC spokesman Jason McDonald tells Axios via email. But measles can be particularly hazardous for babies and young children, he says.

•From 2001-2013, 28% of children younger than 5 years old who had measles had to be treated in the hospital, McDonald said, referring to relatively small outbreaks related to measles patients who traveled to the U.S. from areas where the disease is still

"Some children develop pneumonia (a serious lung infection) or lifelong brain dam-

Different vaccine-hesitant communities added together are causing vaccination rates to fall below effective immunity levels, Anthony Fauci, who leads the National Institutes of Allergy and Infectious Diseases. tells Axios.

"It is kind of like all of the stars are in the right pace for the disaster we're seeing now because we're having multiple factors combining together to give us these outbreaks," Fauci says.

The situation is worrying enough in New York State alone that the CDC issued a stark warning Wednesday: "The longer these outbreaks continue, the greater the chance measles will again get a sustained foothold in the United States."



The bottom line: One relatively morbid source of hope, however, are the widely-reported health impacts from the ongoing outbreaks, with children in intensive care units and an El Al Airlines flight attendant in a coma


"I think unfortunately the best motivation... is that we're having these outbreaks and people are really getting seriously ill," Fauci says. "Those are the things that are going to jolt people into reconsidering this." (Courtesy axios.com)

U.S. Measles Cases Are "Accelerating" Amid A "Global Crisis"

Measles cases in the U.S. jumped last week, with 90 new confirmed cases, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced Monday. The global statistics are also grim, with a 300% increase in preliminary data for the first 3 months of this year compared with last year.

Why it matters: The extremely contagious virus, for which there is a safe and effective vaccine, shows no signs of slowing despite efforts by public health authorities to combat the spread of misinformation with strong measures. International health officials are becoming increasingly concerned about simultaneous, growing outbreaks in multiple countries.



By the numbers: CDC spokesperson Jason McDonald tells Axios: "It appears the outbreak is accelerating. 61 of the 90 cases reported this week had rash onset in April." •This week, CDC reports 555 confirmed cases of measles in 20 states so far in 2019. The previous week showed 465 cases in 19

•This is the second-greatest number of cases reported in the U.S. since measles was considered eliminated in 2000, and it's only mid-April.

Between the lines: The national average vaccination coverage in kindergarten children is at a level (94.3% for 2 doses of the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine for the 2017–2018 school year) consistent with the "herd immunity" necessary to prevent a nationwide outbreak. However, pockets of community resistance to the vaccine are allowing the virus to make inroads, experts have told Axios.

•Globally, the World Health Organization and UNICEF announced Monday that provisional data also shows that in 170 countries there have been more than 112,000 cases so far this year, compared with the numbers from all of last year, which was 28,124 cases from 163 countries.

What they're saying: Peter Hotez, professor and dean of the National School of Tropical Medicine at Baylor College of Medicine, tells Axios:

"The year 2019 may be remembered for the return of measles to America, almost 20 years after it was eliminated in the U.S. We're reaching record levels in terms of numbers of cases and outbreaks, with all of them largely engineered by the anti-vaccine lobby. We now have children in intensive

"If our nation is serious about stopping future measles epidemics, in the coming years it will be essential for us to begin dismantling the anti-vaccine media empire now dominating the internet and social media and e-commerce sites, together with shutting down the non-medical vaccine exemptions currently allowed across most of the U.S."



The heads of the WHO and UNICEF write in an opinion piece for CNN that there's a "global crisis." They implore governments, medical professionals and others to help provide vaccines to lower-income countries and to take a stronger stand against misinformation globally. Per their op-ed:

"Ultimately, there is no 'debate' to be had about the profound benefits of vaccines. We know they are safe, and we know they work. More than 20 million lives have been saved through measles vaccination since the year 2000 alone."

"But children are paying the price for complacency. It will take long-term efforts, political commitment and continuous investment — in vaccine access, in service quality and in trust — to ensure we are, and remain, protected together."

Meanwhile, Madagascar health officials say there have been 1,200 deaths amid more than 117,000 cases in the small, impoverished nation since their measles outbreak began in September, per AP. The country's vaccination rate is only 58%, but it's primarily due to lack of resources instead of vaccination distrust, the report adds.

Plus, the Wall Street Journal reports there's growing evidence that besides the worry of possible serious immediate complications, the virus may also cause a longer-term risk of dampening people's immune systems from responding to other diseases for 2-5 years after measles. (Courtesy axios.com)



那些隐秘的和那些显现的……

《忘记我》是著名作家徐风追寻一位奇女 终结的时刻重新拉开序幕,冥冥中的一种力量 子传奇一生的故事,也是一桩让世界惊叹的英 雄壮举背后的低调秘史。

今天的分享,来自瑾槐书堂的《忘记我》 分享会。徐风携《忘记我》与读者见面,三个 多小时的书外谈,他不仅解读了钱秀玲的精神 脉络,还道出了许多幕后故事。

钱秀玲的生命内涵大于性别,超越了国界。

"如果只有被记录或歌颂的人与事,才是 历史,没有被记录下来的东西,都是让你去遗 忘的……与那些值得被铭记的人相比,她宁愿 自己被遗忘,干干净净地遗忘。'

正是这种宁愿被世人"干干净净地遗忘" 的态度,反而让世人永远记住了她!这部《忘 记我》入选中宣部2021年主题出版重点出版物 、江苏省2021年主题出版重点出版物,

入围 2021 年度"中国好书"文学艺术类图 书榜单。

一、重与轻

大学教师期末的沉重想必对于经历过的老 师们一定能够感同身受,在人生中的一些只看 结果不问过程的残酷时刻,学生们如同渡江者 ,教师们则如同摆渡人。面对不谙水性的落水 者的求"捞捞",摆渡人该如何既拯救落水者 又不因此让如同天平一样的小船失去平衡?这 是上天留给摆渡人的难题。江水有多沉重,这 小船又有多轻,无论轻与重,重要的是他们如

何到达彼岸,然后相忘于江湖。 此刻的我正处于这沉重的时期,为了不被 摆在我眼前的成堆的试卷和批卷的各种行政细 则拖向苦海的深渊,我决定让灵魂暂时从这沉 重中抽离出来,让精神飘向云端。于是我一边 思索着如何打分才能捞起一位能把法文的"接 吻"用中文翻译成"把两个嘴唇粘贴起来"的 小可爱落水者,一边走向一个对我而言具有某 种神圣感的薛福成故居,因为这天下午在瑾槐 书堂将有一场智者的对话。

然而我此行的目的很轻,原本只是为了看 看晓丹,为了向我这位黑夜中的萤火虫朋友挥 一挥手并做个亲昵的鬼脸。至于他们即将谈论 的一本书的内容,我一无所知。只是之前扫了 一眼海报的简介,大约知道这似乎与《辛德勒 的名单》有关,这首乐曲的旋律是印在我脑海 中的,因为作为演出曲目之一,我曾在法国的 各种小教堂里用小提琴将其多次演奏。这首曲 子的沉重感对我来说不是电影中的压抑,而是 曾经演出前的紧张与焦虑,当然还有在那些神 圣的地点捕捉到的灵魂的回声。

在分享创作历程之前,作家徐风老师首先 放了一段短片。短片从叙述者奔赴的一场迟到 的约会讲起,作者与书中的主人公曾以共同的 母语乡音约定在比利时相见,然而由于这迟到 的赴约,约会地点只能是在主人公的墓前,故 事原本可以以此告终,然而历史却时常在看似 让两个守承诺的存在虽然阴阳相隔,但仍心有 灵犀,共同让一些隐匿在时代画卷中的历史细 节慢慢彰显。

据说连结作者与书中主人公的是他们共同 的乡音-宜兴话,只是他们当年通话的声音留在 了历史的空气中,而短片中接下来放的一段珍 贵的影像资料则记录了一段女主人公的法语访 谈,当她在另一个时空用流利的法语将她个人 的某些往事向着未知的世界娓娓道来时,我的 心顿时充满了亲切感,正如她在异国他乡听到 宜兴话的激动,在远离法兰西的岁月听到法语 也同样让我的心沸腾,更何况,这法语是从一 位伟大的中国女性口中讲出,这让我原本轻松 的表情变得庄重。

我继续跟着作者梳理的精神脉络开始一段 灵性之旅,一点一点认识了这位上个世纪的传 奇女性。然而直正让我决定成为这本书的未来 读者的原因,是作者徐风讲述的创作背后的那 些冥冥之中……那股冥冥之中的让103岁的莫瑞 斯老人开口说话的力量,那场在鲁汶大学如洣 宫一样的教室长廊的神秘指引,还有那个在一 棵充满神性的古树旁,透过教室的玻璃窗影射 出的照片上钱秀玲女士的微笑……

随着作者的演讲,我的脑海中出现了两组画 面,是由两条有交集的线引入的两个空间:一条 线将我们引入可见的空间,即现实的人世。在这 个空间里有作者的执着与彷徨,有历史见证人的 信念与迷茫,有出版商的眼光与担当。

也许正是这些人在这可见空间为了尽人事 而做出的努力而得以让另一条线与之相交。如 果说其中的一条线是彰显的,而另一条线则是 隐秘的,后者把我们引入一个神秘的领域 另一个不可见,但应该能感知的空间。

可见的空间是沉重的,因为它承载着无法 卸载的使命感,疲惫的脚步,根扎得极深的树 ,还有沉默的孤独。倒是那个能感知的空间洋 溢着仙气的轻盈,在那个可见的空间绝望到窒 息之际,派来调皮的精灵,给绝望插上希望的 翅膀,教绝望学会飞翔。书中的女主人公钱秀 玲女士也许就是那个精灵,我的灵魂不知不觉 随着她唱的那首古老的歌飞了起来:

"飞飞飞飞,这个样子飞 慢慢飞,这边飞,那边飞 ……哎,这个样子飞到这里来……"

二、关于拯救

我的萤火虫朋友黄晓丹在那个午后如同道 成肉身的维纳斯与雅典娜-美丽与智慧化为一身 ,而坐在她旁边与之对话的作家徐风在我眼中 则如同转世的孔夫子,讲述着他的情怀和他的 无奈。当我向朋友献上鲜花,向作家致以敬意 之后,在回家的路上,我已不再是未来的读者 ,我开始阅读这部写满拯救的书,这书也在读 我,拯救着我。

的被打开,会有多种方式",而我在书中读到 的拯救也有多个层面,并且是层层递进的。在 钱秀玲救人的道路上经历了两场启蒙。

第一场是少年时的她对传说中的一位老婆 婆没能被村民所救的愤怒与诘问: "村上那么 多人为什么不帮助她?" (《忘记我》12页)

第二场则是到了比利时,在学校附近一家 啤酒屋的拐角处由她的未来的丈夫作为施救者 的一场对生命垂危的流浪汉的抢救,施救者要 她去找辆马车,她照做了,从而完成了作为施 救者的辅助者参与了抢救。

这两场救人的启蒙,前者是源自内在良知 而形成的理念,为什么不救的诘问暗示了她对 悲剧的反思,言外之意是年幼的她不懂为什么 对那位老婆婆村民们原本可以救却没有救,而 她的结论是应该救。后者却是在对已经形成的 理念的一次应急的实施,尽管她不是直接的施 救者,但她却是施救的直接参与者,并对抢救 的结果起到关键作用。两场救人的启蒙打开了 她作为拯救者的序幕。

对钱秀玲而言,对人施以援手是一种习惯 ,从她第一次在堂兄钱卓伦和德国将军法肯豪 森的帮助下成功救出神父的女婿,到作者用了 浓墨重彩描写的 "钱秀玲的名单" 上的96位 人质的营救,还有后来陆续从德军处救出的医 生,教师,铁路工人等,在比利时官方给出的 数字中"钱秀玲女士总共拯救了110位人质的生 命。"这些都是她对自己先天形成的理念的惯 性的本能实践。

而对于这些数字的理解,作者引用了一位当 地历史文化研究者,拉丁文教师梅芙妮的观点: "在当地人的价值观里,数字会给人最真切的感 受。历史只提供数字,他不会强迫任何人信奉什 么,反对什么。"数字的精确性的确可以证明营 救结果对于被救者每个个体的分量,然而在接下 来的阅读过程中,作为读者的我试图站在钱秀玲 的角度重新思考这些数字对她的意义时,它们似 乎过分轻盈了。因为在世人眼中的这些负重的数 字不过是她的一贯的善举或者举手之劳,是一种 单向的不求回报的施与。

而真正对她来说产生分量的,带有拯救的 双重性的则是对德国将军法肯豪森的营救。正 如一部《红楼梦》的价值超过成千上万的学术 论文,对于法肯豪森将军的拯救的分量则在她 拯救的道路上可以粉碎所有其它轻飘的数据。

正如钱秀玲不经意地把《圣经》与《道德 经》放在一起比较,其实很多价值的底色都是 一致的,东西方哪来那么多隔阂,人类本身都 是从非洲走出的智人。人总该拯救人的! 三、宽恕与忘却

在书的第十九章《无法补偿的亏欠》中, 作者再现了一直有着故乡情结的钱秀玲在阔别 多年后回到故乡的情景



如果说古人感叹时代的变迁时常会用"物 是人非",然而当时展现在钱秀玲眼前的却连 物也不复存在了。我的家呢?她问,别人给她 指了指稻田,仅剩的小书房成了生产队的仓库 。一声"走吧!"我们可以感到从声音中流露 出的愤怒到静默后的宽恕。为了寄托哀思,她 为祖先建了衣冠冢,然而也在后来的浩劫中被 破坏分成了三段。作者在书中详尽地做了历史 的反思,也许这些都是时间想要忘却的,历史 却将一切铭记。

当钱秀玲自己走到生命的尽头,她的墓朴 素且没有墓志铭,了解了她传奇的人生的作者 和读者都为此而叹息。

其实大可不必,你们看照片上的她的笑容 ,岂会为这等小事而烦忧?这让我想起修昔底 德在被威胁死后的肉身无法体面安葬时发表的 观点: "如果你以为我会在乎我的肉体在地上 腐烂还是在地下腐烂,那就太小看我了!", 套用修昔底德的话,我借用想象力猜想钱女士 也许会对我们这样说:"当灵魂获得自由之时 ,如果你们以为我会在乎墓地的大小和墓志铭 ,那就太小看我了!你们感觉不到我在鲁汶大 学的上空飞吗?否则你们怎么会轻易找到我的 教室?你们感觉不到我在故乡宜兴飞吗?否则 杰罗姆(她的孙子)怎么会知道怎么拐弯,怎 么过桥!"
